These marks should also be used to correctly align the distinctive floats on the lane dividers, but the fixed marks on the deck or walls take precedence for judging.

587 103.16 /M/ FLOATING LANE DIVIDERS AND MARKINGS

588 .1 Floating lane dividers shall extend the full length of the course and shall be attached at each end wall with recessed anchors

- 589 so located that the center line of the cable securing the dividers shall be on the surface of the water with the bottom half 590 uniformly submerged for its entire length. They shall:
- 591 A Separate the racing lanes.
- 592 B /LSC/ Be outside the outermost lanes being used.

593 .2 Dividers shall consist of contiguous floats having a minimum diameter of 5 centimeters (2 inches) to a maximum diameter of 594 15 centimeters (6 inches). The color of the floats extending from the walls the distance of 5 meters for long course and short 595 course meters and 15 feet for short course yards shall be distinct from the rest of the floats. Distinctive colored floats, or 596 markers extending around the full circumference of the floats, shall be placed at 15-meters (49 feet 2-1/2 inches) from each 597 end wall in both short course and long course pools. A fixed mark shall be placed on any wall or the deck adjacent to an 598 outside lane to correctly align the 15 meter buoys for judging underwater starts/turn distances. The mark on the wall or deck 599 will be considered the default marking for officiating purposes. Additionally, in long course pools, a distinctive warning line or 600 lane markers may be placed at a distance of 13 meters from each end wall. Damaged or broken floats shall be removed 601 and/or replaced, to the extent possible.

RESOLUTION REGARDING USA SWIMMING CLUB MEMBERSHIP FEE INCREASE

EFFECTIVE DATE: September 1, 2020 for the 2021 Membership Year

"WHEREAS, we desire that the United States continue to be recognized as the #1 swimming nation in the world; and

WHEREAS, USA Swimming desires to continue to be recognized as being among the flagship National Governing Bodies in the U.S. Olympic Committee's family of sports; and

WHEREAS, the current fee schedule for USA Swimming clubs is set at \$70 per membership year; and

WHEREAS, club membership fees have been a funding source for USA Swimming's successful efforts over the past decade to meet the objectives of Building the Base, Promoting the Sport, and Achieving Sustained Competitive Success in International Competition; and

WHEREAS, USA Swimming's club membership fees have not been adjusted for more than 30 years; and

WHEREAS, USA Swimming also seeks to continue the expansion of its programs, services and support for clubs, including Safe Sport and insurance;

WHEREAS, the USA Swimming Board of Directors has approved the proposal to increase club membership fees to the following levels beginning with the 2021 membership year:

- For existing clubs from \$70 to \$250
- For new, first-year clubs only, from \$70 to \$500
- For seasonal clubs from \$40 to \$70

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the USA Swimming House of Delegates approve a fee increase for annual club members beginning in the 2021 membership year."

CHANGES TO CORPORATE BYLAWS OF USA SWIMMING AS AMENDED BY THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS [Informational Only]

2.6 PRIVILEGES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MEMBERSHIP

- .1 A Coach member of USA Swimming must be at least eighteen (18) years of age. Junior Coach members must be age sixteen (16) or seventeen (17).
- .2 All non-athlete members of USA Swimming must have satisfactorily completed criminal background checks and athlete protection education as required by USA Swimming. The criminal background check requirement is waived for Junior Coach members.
- <u>.3</u> <u>All adult members of USA Swimming, including athletes, and junior coach members must have satisfactorily completed</u> athlete protection education as required by the U.S. Center for SafeSport.
- <u>.34</u> All clubs, including seasonal clubs, shall ensure that all athletes and coaches participating in practices and USA Swimming sanctioned competition are members of USA Swimming.
- .4 5 All referees, starters, administrative officials, chief judges, and stroke and turn judges must be non-athlete members of USA Swimming.
- .6 Employees and volunteers of USA Swimming, Zones, LSCs and member clubs who interact directly and frequently with athletes as a regular part of their duties and individuals with any ownership interest in a member club must be non-athlete members of USA Swimming. This does not apply to volunteers such as timers, marshals, computer operators, etc., who only have limited contact with athletes during a meet; however, any individual who is banned, currently suspended or ineligible for membership is prohibited from serving as a timer, marshal, or computer operator, or otherwise being on deck at any time in connection with a USA Swimming activity.

4.2 VOTING BOARD MEMBERS shall be as listed herein; a minimum of one individual from each zone's geographic area shall be maintained among the members who are elected by the House of Delegates; a minimum of three coaches shall be maintained, inclusive of the Chair of the National Team Steering Committee.
